Principal's Message

27th of June at Bill Rose Sporting Complex, Scone. This was a
difficult decision for the organising school, but was made in the best
interests of the students and the carnival. There is a \$4
participation levy for all students that will be collected on the day.
This is an increase of \$1 due to the extra fees charged for the
preparation and use of the grounds at Scone and the hire of
equipment. The bus will still depart from the front of the school at
7.30am, returning approximately by 3.30pm (check Facebook for
updates). There will be no supervision at school on this day and
students are expected to attend the carnival. Parents are invited to
attend the carnival which is sure to be an enjoyable day. Thank you

Aquis The Future is Bright Pre Kinder Program 2019 Information Session

Parents of students who will be enrolling in Kindergarten in 2020 are invited to an information session on **Tuesday 2^{nd} July at 9.45am** in the school library.

This year the program will be slightly different, in **Term 2**, the Pre Kinder students will join in the day's activities with the Kindergarten students in the Kindergarten classroom. The focus will be on learning the rules and routines of school, building relationships with

the staff members and other students and becoming confident and comfortable in the school environment. There will be lots of play based learning around school readiness. In **Term 3**, the Pre Kinder students will have their own teacher for the day and will begin to learn early literacy and numeracy skills.

Parents/carers must be given sufficient time to purchase items and schools may need to give parents/carers up to three years where there have been changes."

Reports

Teachers are currently writing student reports. Semester 1 student reports will be sent home on <u>Friday 5th of July</u> and will be in a slightly different format than those of last year. Once you receive your child's report, you are invited to make an appointment through the office for an interview to discuss the report and your child's progress.

Visible Wellbeing Message from Sharon Garro Why Knowing Our Character Strengths Can Help Us Do Better Academically And Emotionally

Why does it seem to be easier to focus on what is not going well as opposed to what is going well? Or the bad things that have happened rather than the good? One reason is because we all have a negativity bias, which is designed to help us filter out possible threats to us. Being aware of how a person continues to put us down is a threat to our confidence and our brains are wired to help us feel annoyed and frustrated by this. Our negativity bias is intended to help keep us safe, but it can get to the point where it is in overdrive and we only see what can possibly harm us (physically, emotionally or mentally). Psychology has for many decades focused on relieving the effects of possible threats or actual threat by focusing on how to address anxiety, depression, post traumatic stress and the like. However, it is just as useful to also focus on things that help us feel safe, secure and calm, as when we are in this state, we are wired to learn and to build positive relationships. This is where the research of Character Strengths comes in.

55 social scientists spent 5 years researching different cultures, religions and moral codes to find out what characteristics people display when they are happy, thriving, confident, calm and doing well. Through this research, the 24 most cited characteristics were those listed as the VIA Character Strengths-things such as kindness, honesty, gratitude, perseverance, teamwork etc

We now use the language of Character Strengths to help young people know what resources they have inside of them to help them be their best. When we help them identify these and find ways to use them, they begin to feel more competent, know their own unique identity and be happy to contribute things that they value. When we experience wellbeing, research also shows that not only are we more resilient but much better able to learn and do our best academically. Use the VIA Character Strengths website to help you understand those traits that lead people to be their best and help your children identify what makes them unique.

Year 1 & 2




This week in science and technology we have been given this problem:





3/4/5/6




On Tuesday 25th June, 5/6 will attend the morning tea held by the CWA where they will see their projects displayed and hear the results of the judging.





underway and it's great to see so many children out in the playground skipping and continuing to develop amazing skills. Murrurundi Public School has already raised \$180 so far!




