Parents and Visitors Policy

Please find the Murrurundi Public School Parents and Visitors Policy in this newsletter. This policy aims to ensure that all visitors to the school conduct themselves in an appropriate manner. Please familiarise yourself with this policy. Unfortunately, some of the expectations listed in this policy have not been adhered to by some parents or visitors recently. It is of utmost importance for the welfare of all members of our school community that the rights of our students, teachers and parents are respected.

Picking up

Please note that children are not permitted to leave the school grounds with adults or friends (or on their own) unless written or verbal authorisation has been provided by the parent or carer. This is in the interests of child protection and safety. All students must wait outside the office until a parent/carer collects them from inside the grounds. As discussed at the most recent P&C meeting, I am currently writing a school procedure for picking up due to some recent incidents of students leaving with people that they did not have permission to leave with.

Teacher Chat

Teachers are available for an informal chat every afternoon at pick up time, outside the school office. Alternatively, you can make an appointment for a formal interview with the teacher or through the school office. Please note that before school, teachers are preparing to provide their classes with the best possible learning experiences and are unavailable, unless you have made an appointment with them.

Office Hours

Please note that the office does not open until 9.00am and that students, parents and visitors are not permitted to enter the school grounds, without prior consent, until this time.

Playground

The Playground/ Play Gym is closed to all children in the afternoons, as it is unsupervised.

Uniform Review

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
