### Newsletter Term 4 Week 3

It was great to see everyone return back from the holidays, ready to start a new term. We have already been busy with the colour run, Healthy Harold and rock paintings for the flower show.

### Check in

All students in years 3, 4 and 5 will complete Check in Assessments in Reading and Numeracy over the next wo weeks. These assessments were introduced during COVID to replace NAPLAN, and are now used to track student achievement every six months. We look forward to seeing how our students have improved since they last completed the assessments.

### **Behaviour strategy**

The NSW Department of Education is committed to creating engaging and effective classrooms, and inclusive and safe school communities for all NSW public school students. Students and staff have the right and responsibility to engage in positive and respectful relationships based on valuing the interests, abilities and diversity of others.

The aim of the Student Behaviour policy and procedures is that all NSW public school students:

• are supported to participate positively, and engage in their learning and in the wider community

• are supported to demonstrate positive and respectful behaviour that will contribute to an inclusive

and safe school learning environment consistent with their responsibilities under the Work Health

and Safety (WHS) policy

• have the opportunity to self-advocate as active participants in their own learning and wellbeing

• are encouraged to feel connected and use their social and emotional skills to be respectful, resilient

and safe in line with the Behaviour Code for Students.

This overview should be read in conjunction with the policy and procedures, that outline the

individual responsibilities and delegations of department staff.

#### Rationale for change

Suspension rates are disproportionately high for students with disability, Aboriginal students, students in rural and remote are as, students in out of home care and students experiencing socioeconomic disadvantage. We are introducing the policy and procedures to support vulnerable groups to stay in school and ensure every student is safe, engaged and can continue learning with positive behaviour support. Supporting and enabling positive student behaviour is essential for quality learning, as well as the wellbeing and safety of all students and staff.

During Term 4, we will be developing our school behaviour management plan and anti bullying plan which will be consulted with the community before implementation.

Next week we will welcome Aaron Roberts and Kaitlin Smith, from Newcastle University, into our school as they complete their third year practicum. Mr Roberts will join the 3-4 class and Miss Smith will work with K-1-2. We look forward to their visit.

Goodness! What a busy and fun start to the term we have had. A visit from Healthy Harold and a Colour Run! A big thank you to the families in our class that raised money for our school fundraiser. In our classroom during Literacy sessions the students have been learning about perspective. Our mentor text has been *The Mess We Made* by Michelle Lord. The students have been investigating how we as humans can protect marine life by not polluting. We made some great posters to persuade our friends at school to pick up the rubbish and not litter. In Mathematics we have been making the connections between addition and multiplication by using a strategy known as repeated addition. We have also learnt how multiplication and division are related. We now know about the symbols that are used for multiplication and division.

### 3-4 Class News

Welcome back everyone! It was great to hear about everyone's holiday adventures. We have already had a busy start to the term. We had a visit from Healthy Harold, where we did the Mind Your Medicine unit. We learnt about prescription and non-prescription drugs and how they enter the body; identifying how medicines can be used and stored safely; developing an understanding of how medical drugs enter our bodies; and techniques for effective and assertive communication. We will follow up Harold's visit up with some lessons in PDH.

In Maths we have been introduced to equivalent number sentences using addition and subtraction, finding all the factors of a number using arrays and revising our flexible number thinking. This week we move onto number patterns, tessellations, symmetry and angles.

We have started reading The Sugarcane Kids and the Red Bottomed Boat. This is a story set in far north Queensland close to the Daintree Rainforest. As we read the story, we have been looking at different aspects of the setting - land cleared for farming, sugarcane crops, mangroves, crocodiles etc. This story is highly engaging.

Both year 3 and year 4 will be completing check in assessments over the next two weeks. This is an assessment similar to NAPLAN, however, it only provides data back to the school on how they are going in Reading and Numeracy. They completed the assessments this time last year, so it will be exciting to see how they have improved by.

A reminder that homework is due back on Fridays. Every student who can secretly tell me the answer to the following question by Friday will receive an extra thumbs up.





### Year 5/6

It was a pleasure to return to learning again for a busy and productive term 4. This term we will be studying Global connections in both English and Geography. In Numeracy we have been studying Patterns and Algebra, learning about equivalence, determining missing values and BODMAS. During week 1 we had the opportunity to participate in the Life Education program, exploring concepts such as mutual respect, personal connections and online communication.
