Term 2

Term 2 starts back on Tuesday 26 April for staff only. We are planning to join in with some training at Scone Public School. Our school office will be opened for inquiries, uniform purchases etc. **Students start back on Wednesday 27 April.**

Update for COVID restrictions

The last three weeks have proved to be quite challenging, with many students testing positive for COVID 19. Thank you to all families who acted promptly by isolating their children and notifying the school. As new cases are reported, information will be sent out.

Continuation of use of RATs for symptomatic testing

As part of the NSW Government's focus on minimising disruptions to teaching and learning, the department will continue to support the use of rapid antigen tests (RATs) for symptomatic testing until at least the end of Term 1.

Another supply of RAT kits have been sent home with students this week.

All schools should continue to implement our current layered (baseline) measures:

- Students, staff and visitors must stay home and test if sick
- Maximise ventilation and distancing where practicable
- Enhanced daily cleaning
- Focus on personal hygiene
- All school staff are required to be double vaccinated against COVID-19
- All students are encouraged to get the COVID-19 vaccine

At MPS, we are taking additional measures and are requesting all staff and visitors to wear masks.

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If there is a positive case in your child's class, year or other grouping, your child can continue to attend school in line with NSW Health advice. All positive cases of students or staff must be reported to the school and to Services NSW.

Isolation Requirements

If a student or staff member lives with someone who has COVID-19 then they must follow the NSW Health COVID-19 guidelines and self-isolate for 7 days. The student/staff member must also follow the NSW Health Self-Isolation Guidelines for 7 days if they have been notified to do this by NSW Health.

Self-isolation means you must stay at your home or accommodation and remain separated from others. You can only leave to get medical care (such as a COVID-19 test) or in an emergency. You cannot have visitors.

You must self-isolate for the amount of time you are told to. Your self-isolation period starts from the day you were tested or exposed to someone with COVID-19. If you have to self-isolate for 7 days, for example, and you were tested at 10am on Tuesday, your self-isolation period ends at 10am on the following Tuesday. You must follow any health advice provided about when you can leave self-isolation.

If a student or staff member lives with someone who has COVID-19 then they must follow the NSW HEalth COVID-19 guidelines and self-isolate for 7 days. The student/staff member must also follow the NSW Health Self-Isolation Guidelines for 7 days if they have been notified to do this by NSW Health.

A household contact does not need to repeat isolation if another person in their household tests positive in the 14 days after their 7 day isolation period ends.

If another person in their household tests positive for COVID-19 more than 14 days after their 7 day isolation period ends, they will have to isolate again and follow the instructions for household contacts of people with COVID-19.
