Principals Report

Term 3 has started with a bang! We've already participated in NAIDOC celebrations, World of Maths Day, an excursion to the Quirindi Theatre and Kindergarten celebrated 100 days of learning. We've had the Zone Athletics Carnival postponed twice and we are hoping that the third attempt will be our lucky attempt. The carnival has been rescheduled to Wednesday next week - 10 August. Notes went home on Tuesday. We still have many more learning opportunities coming up this term.

Education Week

This week is Education Week, however, due to the restrictions placed on school events, we will be postponing our celebrations until week 6. The date and activities will be confirmed after the P&C Meeting this week. Watch this space.

Update for COVID restrictions

Under a directive issued from the Department of Education, we are restricting events onsite for the first four weeks of term. While masks are not mandatory, it is strongly recommended that all staff and adults on site wear one. We are still receiving enhanced cleaning during the day. Any students showing symptoms associated with COVID are to stay home, even if they test negative. We have had a few positive cases of COVID over the last few weeks. We will continue to keep you updated on this situation.

Continuation of use of RATs for symptomatic testing

As part of the NSW Government's focus on minimising disruptions to teaching and learning, the department will continue to support the use of rapid antigen tests (RATs) for symptomatic testing until at least the end of Term 1. Another supply of RAT kits will be sent home with students this week.

Child Protection

All classes will be participating in Child Protection classes this term. They will cover a variety of topics including respect, responsibilities, bullying, changes that occur to the body and what to do when feeling unsafe or uncomfortable. There will be discussion regarding body parts using correct anatomical names. This content is a mandatory component of our PDHPE syllabus. We will be using units of work

devised by the Department of Education. If you have any concerns about the content being taught, please contact the school.

Making Time to Speak with teachers

A quick reminder to all parents and carers that you need to call into the office and book time to speak to your child's teacher. We are asking that you respect the small amount of time teachers have for preparation in the morning by not turning up unannounced at the classrooms. Teachers will endeavour to meet with you as soon as possible.

Personal Hygiene

It is wonderful to see our students take responsibility for their personal hygiene by bringing deodorant to school to apply as needed. Deodorant must be roll-on style as aerosol cans are not allowed to come to school. Unfortunately we often see aerosol cans being sprayed at other students without any thought to allergies, sensitivities or asthma. We thank you in advance for ensuring your child adheres to this request.

In our classroom over the past 2 weeks, we have started a new spelling program with the Kindergarten class. The focus is on a different phoneme (sound) each week and we have been introduced to Milo the monkey and his animal friends. So far, we have met Leo the lion and Vicky the vulture. In Mathematics we have been collecting data about ourselves and thinking about the different ways we can display the information. As you can see from the picture, we used a human bar graph to display the student's heights. We had a great day at Blandford, taking part in some NAIDOC activities and working through a number of Mathematics problems through games. Everyone was so engaged and worked through the activities with their friends, completing some difficult tasks. Over the past two terms Kindergarten have been counting the days that they have been at school. On Tuesday 26th July we reached the huge milestone of 100 days at school. To celebrate, we had a class picnic with our toy friends and investigated the number 100. We all look forward to the next 100 days.

Year 3/4

We have had a flying start to term 3. It was wonderful to see our students return and ready to learn. Even though we have had a number of events over our first two weeks, with World of Maths Day, NAIDOC celebrations and an excursion to Quirindi Theatre this week, students have very quickly settled into routine.

There has been a slight adjustment with staffing this term. Mrs Darlington will work with 3-4 Monday to Wednesday and Mrs Paterson will take the class on Thursday and Friday.

This term, we are studying Aboriginal artist and writer, Brownyn Bancroft. We are looking at the rich language in her books to improve our writing and using her artworks as inspiration for our own art. In maths, we will be focusing on chance, collecting data and displaying in table form and graph form and revising written methods for addition and subtraction.

In Science, we have started our unit on Forces. Students completed an experiment to devise how many different ways they could move a balloon and make it change direction and speed. This is helping to build our knowledge on the forces of pushing and pulling.

In PDH, we are completing a child protection unit called My Right to be Safe. We will spend the few weeks looking at respect, responsibility and support networks - adults that can help when we are feeling uncomfortable in any situation.

Mrs Paterson will work through the Geography unit with students. They are studying Australia and its neighbours.

New homework books have been issued to all students. It was wonderful to see so many returned last week. Let's hope we can keep this going. 
We look forward to being able to complete in the Zone Athletics carnival soon.


