

In the Dhinawan Room this fortnight the students have been busy collecting data in Mathematics and learning about the different ways we can display our findings. We have created bar graphs and pictographs and used Glyphs to create some interesting pictures. We have also investigated measuring length using informal units of measurement. During Literacy sessions we have been reading the book Hey, Little Ant by Hannah Hoose. We have been discussing perspective and how we can see other people's points of view. Kindergarten have continued to learn about Milo and his friends. We were introduced to Vicky the Vulture. All the students enjoyed their trip to Quirindi to watch The Owls Apprentice. From all accounts, this was a very worthwhile experience.



Year 3/4

Welcome to our new class member, Alyssa. Alyssa and her family have recently moved to Murrurundi. 3-4 have done a wonderful job of introducing Alyssa to MPS. 3-4 have been busy busy over the last two weeks. We have finished reading Rohal Dahl's book The BFG and we are looking forward to watching the movie and comparing the two.

In writing, we have been learning how to include effective descriptive language, including similes. We have been modelling our work on author and illustrator Bronwyn Bancroft. We will start some artworks inspired by her this week.

Students have been revising their time tables, and mental strategies for addition and subtraction. We have also spent some time understanding the process of using written models to add and subtract with and without trading. This has been quite challenging, so we will keep revising the work until everyone is more familiar with it. Students have also been learning about collecting, recording and presenting data. We have specifically focused on picture graphs and column graphs.

In Science, students have started investigating the force of friction. They will conduct an experiment to test out their ideas about how friction works.

It has been pleasing to see so many students completing and returning their homework. Students in 3-4 are expected to practice their spelling and read for 10-15 minutes each school night. If you are having and difficulties with homework, do not hesitate to contact me during school hours.
