K-1 News

With great excitement last week, we had a visit from Ms Mitchell, who will take over teaching the K-1 class from the beginning of term 2. Students had a wonderful day working with her. Ms Mitchell also attended the P&C Meeting to Introduce herself and meet some of our parents.

Students have been busy working in all areas of the curriculum. Our classroom routines and expectations have been embedded and its pleasing to see so many of our students striving to do the right thing.

Kindergarten have started learning about sounds. They have excellent listening skills and can hear beginning and ending sounds. They have learnt to 'read' and write m, s, f and a. Now that they know a vowel, they will start blending to make simple words. Year 1 have started spelling groups and are learning about digraphs – two letters making one sound.

Over the last two weeks, we have been solving maths challenges set by Captain Beard and Pirate Bonny. Students have been learning about measuring mass, capacity, area and length through real life problems. This week, we move onto learning about estimation and number sense.

In Science, we have completed our first unit of work about Living Things. We are now looking at the External Features of Animals.

It is fantastic to see ongoing support with homework. Nearly all students return their homework at some time during the week, to change readers and story books. Keep an eye out for Nights of Reading Certificates. As students achieve the levels, certificates will be issued.

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Class 2/3/4

In Science & Technology, year 3 and 4 have been studying food and fibre production, looking at the journey of products from the farm to the consumer. In the last fortnight we looked at the impact of technology on agriculture. The students designed, built and tested a model of an irrigation system for a vegetable garden. It was interesting to see all the original and different designs that the students came up with, and how they realised the modifications they needed to make to their design along the way. We were really proud of how they worked together in their groups, and persisted when things didn't work the way they planned.

Week 7 Assembly









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5/6

This past fortnight has been very busy in 5/6. We have begun our writing pieces for our end of term assessment. Students have been allowed creative freedom to write a narrative of their own choosing, where they are able to demonstrate their understanding of the different structures and writing techniques that we have learnt this term. We have continued our exploration of numbers in Maths, learning about simplifying and converting fractions and different strategies for addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

Our Art has been focused on the works of famous artist, Vincent Van Gogh. We have used chalk pastels to recreate our own versions of Van Gogh's famous Sunflowers. The class have been able to experiment with using pastels to blend colours together to create different effects on their art. In Science we've been researching sustainable eating, farming and packaging. We've looked at sustainable products like edible spoons as a replacement for plastic cutlery and the class had a go at coming up with their own concepts for sustainable packaging solutions for different products.
