Welcome to Additional Staff

Changes to Staff Development Days in 2025

It was announced last week as part of the new salary agreement for teachers that there will be nine staff development days (pupil free days) in 2025. There will be four in term 1, two in term 2, two in term 3 and one in term 4. Some of these days are earmarked specifically for professional development, while others have been left to the discretion of the school. The days are scheduled by the Department of Education and not individual schools.

So, what does this mean for families? Families will need to be aware that they will have to provide or find suitable supervision for their children on these days.

School in 2025 will begin on Thursday 6 February for all students in Years 1 – 6. Kindergarten's start date is yet to be determined. We will notify parents of this as soon as we can. Our office, however, will be open from the 31 January if you need to pick up uniforms etc.

Principal Visit

K-1-2 Class News

We have moved back into out usual classroom. While it was nice to have a larger space to work, the room was very noisy. Last week we welcomed Miss Crump from Newcastle University to our school. She will spend three more weeks with us. She has been familiarising herself with the classroom and students, and teaching a few lessons. This week her workload will increase as she teaches Kinder maths, drama, writing, and PE. She will also help put with reading groups and online assessments which will start this week.

In literacy, we have been reading the book Iggy Peck Architect, and some other texts about bridges. We are using what we have learnt to build a bridge, write a set of instructions and have someone else test our instructions out. This should be lots of fun

In maths, we have been learning about a wide range of topics. Kindergarten have been consolidating their understanding of numbers 0 -20. Putting them into order, stating the number before and after any given number and trusting the count when adding on. Year 1/2 have been learning ab out rounding to the nearest ten, adding on and taking away tens, and sharing into set groups. E.g. share 15 into 3 groups. They have already put this learning to good use, problem solving.

In Science we are learning about the Earth's resources and how we can use them wisely.

Mr Leayr has been joining us every Wednesday for singing. This has been a highly engaging and much anticipated activity through-out the week. We ended the week on a high with a visit from Healthy Harold.

Next week (week 6) will be our last whole school assembly for the year. Students will only have until next Friday to earn any thumbs up needed for awards.




Our Early Birds Pre Kinder Program

This past fortnight has continued the busy start to term 4 for 3-6. We have continued our close reading sessions online with our APCI Mrs Denning, where students have been analysing texts which explore the Aboriginal seasons. During our sessions we have a key focus on comprehension, spelling and vocabulary, where students are annotating the texts to draw out information and make connections to their prior knowledge. Our Maths has focused around the concepts of Multiplication, Area and Volume with students furthering their ability to use a range of multiplicative strategies to solve different problems flexibly.

In Week 3, some of our Years 4-6 girls travelled to Denman to play in the Debbie Carroll League Tag Gala Day. Despite joining with St Joseph's of Denman, the girls were a player down with no subs for the 4 games across the day. Putting up a fighting effort in all games, the girls showed great skill and sportsmanship and thoroughly enjoyed their time on the field. Thank you to the parents who were able to organise lifts for the day on short notice to allow the girls to participate in the day. I would also like to welcome Miss Gould to the 3-6 class. Miss Gould is joining us for weeks 4-7 whilst she completes her prac as part of her university studies. Throughout the 4 weeks she will be in the classroom teaching a range of lessons.
